- **What is Restored Order?** For a variety of historical and pastoral reasons, Confirmation and reception of Holy Communion began to occur later in the lives of the Catholic children in many parts of the world. During the first decade of the 20th century, Pope St Pius X sought to reverse course on this gradual drift by exhorting pastors across the globe to allow children as young as 7 or 8 to receive Holy Communion. At the same time he did not specifically address Confirmation and as a result many dioceses continued to delay that sacrament until late adolescence, several years after children had received their First Holy Communion. Over a century later, the Holy Spirit has been stirring a desire throughout the Church to restore the order of the sacraments of initiation. A number of bishops have taken the step to lower the age of Confirmation to 7-8(the age of discretion) and require that the Eucharist be the final sacrament of initiation given to baptized Catholics. By early 2028 this will be the normal practice in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee.
- **Religious Education:** Begins on **Sunday, August 17th** after Mass, with an ice cream social to begin registration. This RE school year will be a little bit different than in the past. There will be \$5 charge for every child registered at Saint Anne's. The reason for this change is to help with expenses RE accumulates throughout the year. This minor expense, as well as any other fundraisers will serve as spending money for books, activities like the ones listed above, all retreats, and snacks for our students.
