Catholic tradition asks the living saints in Heaven—who are more alive than we are—to join their prayers with ours before the throne of God. The truth of the matter is that every bead leads to Christ. Every mystery points to His incarnation, passion, and resurrection. Every repetition is like breathing with His heartbeat. To meditate on the Rosary is to enter the Gospel through His Mother's eyes—not to replace Him, but to encounter Him more deeply. Mary never says, Look at me!" Rather, she says, "Do whatever He tells you." (John 2:5)
